## VINCI is awarded a new contract with the European Investment Bank, the European Union's financing institution

The 50/50 consortium formed by CFE, a Belgian subsidiary of VINCI, and VINCI Construction Grands Projets has just been awarded a  $\leq$ 135m contract for the construction of a new office building for the European Investment Bank's headquarters in Luxembourg.

This new building will be built on the present site of the EIB, the European Union's financing institution, where there is already one building and an extension. To be enclosed in a cylindrical glass casing, the building will comprise nine floors of offices and two levels of underground car parking, three heated atriums and three naturally ventilated winter gardens, representing 72,000 square metres in total.

The transparency of the glass casing and of the winter gardens is designed to reduce energy consumption and emissions into the atmosphere.

Work on the new site will start shortly and will last 28 months.

VINCI specialises in the construction of very high buildings, having notably delivered the largest residential and commercial complex in Asia, with a floor area of 700,000 square metres, at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. CFE has been operating for more than thirty years in Luxembourg, where it has undertaken major office building construction projects.

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
