VINCI wins a new airport concession in Cambodia

On Thursday 6 September, Jean-Claude Gayssot, the French minister for public works, transport and housing, and Antoine Zacharias, Chairman of VINCI, officially opened the new terminal A at Phnom Penh airport in Cambodia, where VINCI has the 25 year concession.

On this same occasion, VINCI signed an additional contract with the Cambodian authorities granting the concession for the Siem Reap airport to the Phnom Penh airport concession company in which VINCI has a 70% stake.

Alongside its Malaysian partner Muhibbah, VINCI is the concession holder at the two largest international airports in Cambodia, Phnom Penh and Siem Reap. The strong growth in tourist activity in Cambodia, which is the country's prime source of foreign currency, is generating a rapid increase in air traffic to these destinations, especially since Siem Reap gives access to the temples of Angkor.

VINCI's portfolio today consists of 26 long term airport concessions. In addition to the two Cambodian airports, VINCI is also concession operator in 22 airports in Mexico, as well as Beijing and Liège, amounting to a total of 40 million passengers per year.

VINCI intends to continue to grow in the airport business, as shown by the takeover bid for 100% of the stock of the UK company TBI announced recently on 15 July, the result of which should be made public at the end of October.
